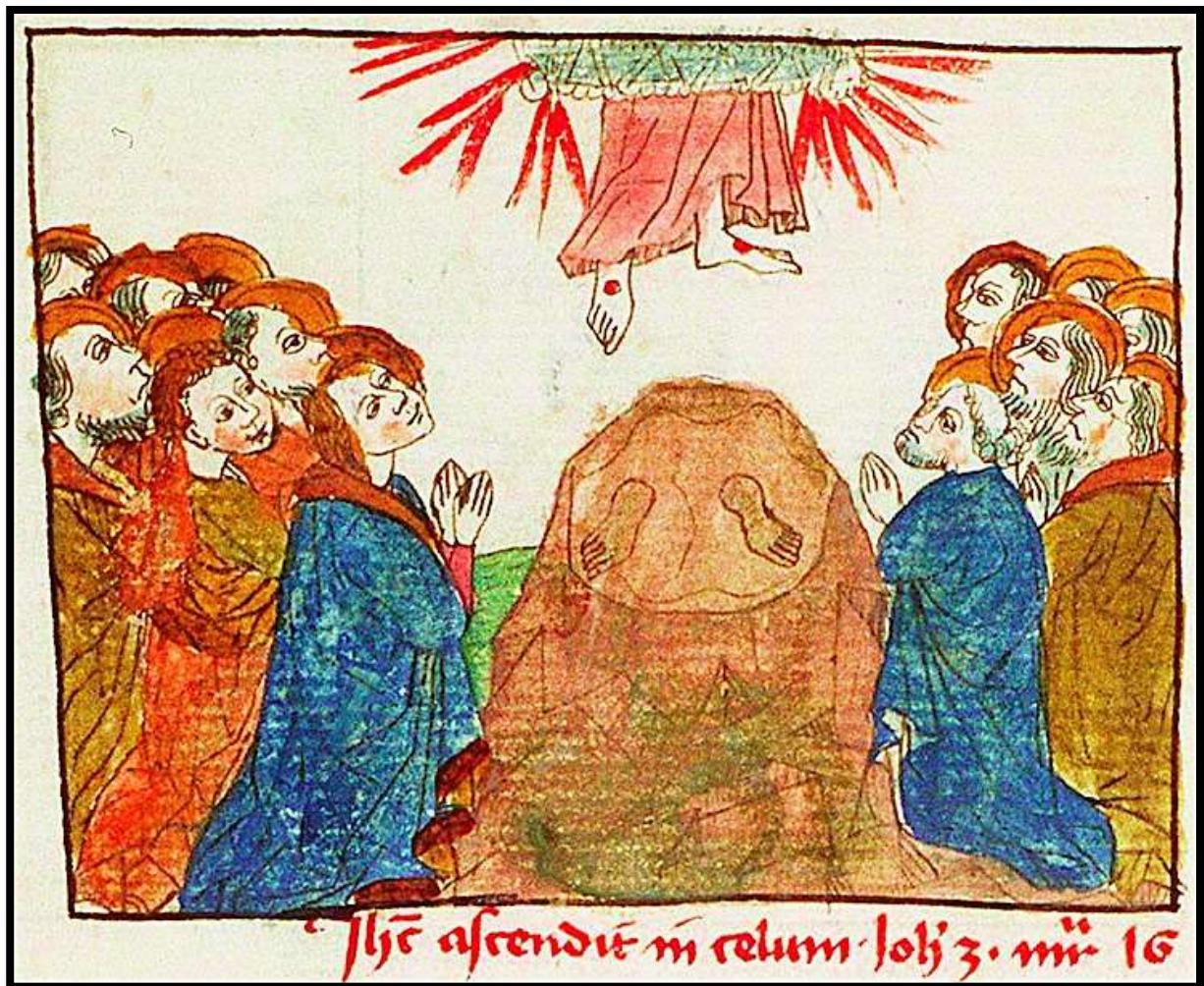

A Reading from the Book of Daniel

Sermon

Today is Ascension Day. We are remembering the day when Jesus went out to a hill with his disciples 40 days after his resurrection, and they watched him returning to heaven. We are told that it looked as if Jesus was going upwards. I do not think of this so much as Jesus floating up into the sky, rather we might think of it as the disciples trying to understand how it was that Jesus disappeared from their sight. We know that high places and clouds played a significant part in some of the most dramatic episodes in the Bible - e.g. the Transfiguration.

This was the last time on Earth, as far as we know for sure, that Jesus was seen and identified as Jesus in human form. The purpose of today's feast day is to give us a sense of being with the disciples on top of the hill. This may be hard, sitting at home, perhaps in isolation, but bring to mind the last time you were on top of Old Winchester Hill or Beacon Hill. Six months ago, I had a very profound sense of the Ascension, on top of a mountain in Wales. I had even been followed by a flock of sheep and had thought about Jesus saying to Peter 'Feed my sheep'.

If we look down from the vantage point in our mind's eye we can look back to when Jesus first came to Earth, as a new-born baby. We are not looking back to last Christmas, Christmas 2019, we are looking right back to the first Christmas over 2000 years ago.

From our Ascension hilltop, we can look back to Jesus' life and all the travelling around he did. Jesus walked from town to town, from village to village, healing the sick, teaching, and above all showing love and compassion for all the people.

We can look back to the cross Jesus went to the cross not as a victim, but as a conqueror -- not out of a sense of defeat, but out of a sense of love. We can remember what a great victory over evil was won there.

And we can look back to that first Easter morning Death could not hold the Lord of Life any longer and Jesus burst into an even more full life than ever.

Today marks the end of Jesus' time on Earth, the last time that he was tied to a time and restricted to a single place. Today, we are celebrating his triumphal return to heaven, having won that victory over death and defeated the power of evil for us. It was at this time the potential of the Holy Spirit was unleashed in the full to do its marvellous works, which we celebrate in 10 days' time of Pentecost.

From today's Ascension hill, we are also able to look forward into the future. And what do we find in the future? Amongst other things, we can see all of us, aching to return to our churches as soon as possible but as safely as we can, with our lives transformed and filled with the joy that comes from our faith in the living Jesus.

Alleluia. Amen.

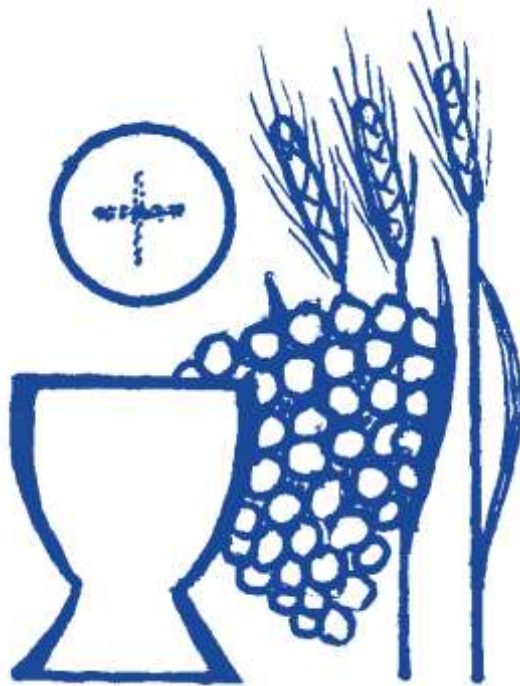
