"He said, 'Go out and stand on the mountain before the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by.' Now there was a great wind, so strong that it was splitting mountains and breaking rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake; ¹² and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire; and after the fire a sound of sheer silence. ¹³When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood at the entrance of the cave. Then there came a voice to him that said, 'What are you doing here, Elijah?' ¹⁴He answered, 'I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of hosts; for the Israelites have forsaken your covenant, thrown down your altars, and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking my life, to take it away.' ¹⁵Then the LORD said to him, 'Go, return on your way to the wilderness of Damascus; when you arrive, you shall anoint Hazael as king over Aram. ¹⁶Also you shall anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as king over Israel; and you shall anoint Elisha son of Shaphat of Abel-meholah as prophet in your place. ¹⁷Whoever escapes from the sword of Hazael, Jehu shall kill; and whoever escapes from the sword of Jehu, Elisha shall kill. ¹⁸Yet I will leave seven thousand in Israel, all the knees that have not bowed to Baal, and every mouth that has not kissed him.'

Of how much more value are you than the birds! ²⁵And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? ²⁶If then you are not able to do so small a thing as that, why do you worry about the rest? ²⁷Consider the lilies, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. ²⁸But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, how much more will he clothe you – you of little faith! ²⁹And do not keep striving for what you are to eat and what you are to drink, and do not keep worrying. ³⁰For it is the nations of the world that strive after all these things, and your Father knows that you need them. ³¹Instead, strive for his kingdom, and these things will be given to you as well.

³² Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom. ³³Sell your possessions, and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. ³⁴For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

SERMON

'For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing.'

There is too much to say about Francis to fit the time we have; he tried to convert unbelievers and educate the poorly informed, or at least to attain martyrdom in so doing. He started the practice of setting up a crib in church to celebrate the Nativity. He lived alongside the poorest and the outcast. He saw God in all creation. Francis died in 1226, having started a revolution and the Franciscans endure to this day.

As his story unfolds, think about the sayings of Jesus, think about his willingness to speak with lepers; think about what he said about living simply; remember 'life is more than food, and the body more than clothing', and how Francis, and his C21 followers offer us an example,

Giovanni, the son of Pietro Bernardone, a wealthy cloth merchant in Assisi, worked with his father until he was 20, by this time known by his nickname, Francesco, the French one, Francis. He was well known in Assisi for his love of parties and celebrations. In 1202, as a result of a

border dispute between Assisi and Perugia, Francis was taken prisoner and held for a year. On his release he returned to Assisi and continued his energetic way of life.

However, after a long period of illness and a further taste of army life, Francis began to grow weary of his lifestyle. He made a pilgrimage to Rome,

and was greatly affected by the beggars that he met in the city. When he returned to Assisi, Francis resigned from his father's business and left his old friends behind. He stole a bag of cloth from his father and sold it, using the proceeds to repair church buildings.

When his father objected to having his goods sold without his consent, the bishop commanded Francis to repay the money. He did. He also renounced his father and gave back everything he had ever been given, even his garments. He began a life of perfect evangelical poverty, living by begging and even then only accepting the worst food that people had to give. He was never reconciled with his father.

A rich man sold everything and joined him in living next to a leper colony; a canon from a neighbouring church gave up his position and joined them also.

While working on the Church of S Damiano one morning they looked into the Gospel according to St Matthew and saw the story of the rich young man whom Jesus told to sell everything; they saw Jesus telling his disciples to take nothing with them on their journey; they saw Jesus saying that his followers must also carry his cross. Francis understood these words to be directly spoken to him.

He preached to all the love of God and the love of the created world; because, having renounced everything, he celebrated everything he received, or saw, or heard, as a gift. People soon began to join the man who by now had a reputation for simple living and charity rather than for extreme behaviour and partying.

On this basis, he formed a group of followers, who called themselves the 'Friars Minor' and they quickly developed into a religious order. The order spread, and Francis travelled. He attempted to reach Africa, but illness forced him back to Italy. He journeyed with the Crusaders, but preached a spiritual crusade rather than a physical war.

He returned to Italy, and divided his rapidly growing order into manageable districts. He appointed other people to be in charge and wrote a 'Rule of Life'. Francis resisted seeking full approval for his order from the Pope until 1223. Even though it must have seemed at once impractical and subversive, to set thousands of holy men wandering penniless round the towns and villages of Europe, the Pope was persuaded.

Because Francis was wearing an old brown garment begged from a peasant, tied round the middle with string, that became the Franciscan habit. Within ten years 5,000 men were wearing it. By the time of his death there was a men's order, a women's order (instituted by Clare) and a lay order. A hundred years later Dante was buried in it because it was more glorious than cloth of gold.

It is reported that Francis received the gift of stigmata, marks like the wounds of Christ, in 1224, and he died in 1226. Francis is known as a gentle and generous man who radically altered his life in response to God. Fully devoted to God, and fully prepared to give everything for others, his life of humility and action have led to him to be remembered as one of the most influential men of medieval times.

Most High, Glorious God, enlighten the darkness of our minds. Give us a right faith, a firm hope and a perfect charity, so that we may always and in all things act according to Your Holy Will. Francis of Assisi: Vocation Prayer
