



22 When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord <sup>23</sup>(as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), <sup>24</sup>and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

25 Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. <sup>26</sup>It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. <sup>27</sup>Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, <sup>28</sup>Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

<sup>29</sup> 'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace,  
according to your word;

<sup>30</sup> for my eyes have seen your salvation,

<sup>31</sup> which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

<sup>32</sup> a light for revelation to the Gentiles  
and for glory to your people Israel.'

33 And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. <sup>34</sup>Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed <sup>35</sup>so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

36 There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, <sup>37</sup>then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. <sup>38</sup>At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

39 When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. <sup>40</sup>The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

## SERMON

Today is pivot point between the celebration of the incarnation through the forty days of Christmas, which include in lectionary order, not a logical sequence, the Epiphany, the Holy Innocents, and the Baptism of Christ, with several saints' days and the Conversion of Paul along the way— and the preparation for Christ's Passion.

Today, we come to the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, or Candlemas. Huge importance is placed on the first-born in the Jewish tradition, not least in terms of sacrifice. The killing of the Holy Innocents reminds us that Christ was born into a real world with real evil at work. He had a real life that ended with him being killed by the authorities, as the other innocents had been. Then, he became for us a 'full and perfect sacrifice' so that we may live. To use the phrase from this morning's Gospel, God's 'light for the revelation of the gentiles' (v32) was not to be extinguished by Herod. At Jesus' baptism in the flowing Jordan we are reminded of the Jewish tradition of purification is important

After childbirth was one such time of purification when women were required to undergo ritual purification and, so, forty days after Jesus was born, Mary went with Jesus to the temple for that ceremony. Indeed, the early Church called the festival we are celebrating today, the Purification of the BVM. It was marked by a procession of candles into church, as Mary brought the saving light into the world, so lights were symbolically brought into church before communion. It was from that tradition that the festival earned the mediaeval nickname of Candlemas. More importantly, Jesus was presented to God in the House of God, as Malachi foretold.

When Malachi was writing, God's people were in exile far from home and Temple -- and far from God. The announcement of God's coming in this passage from Malachi is surely all they long for? But, there is a warning in Malachi's words, the people should not assume that the coming will be a comfortable experience. The work of a fuller was an essential part of the treatment of freshly woven cloth to make it supple, pure and ready to use. Fuller's soap is very caustic -- it is made from plant and wood ash -- and its use is to clean and swell new cloth. This vigorous process involved washing and bleaching, soaking and beating until the fibres were in a consistent and desirable condition. Cloth was not ready for use until the fuller had cleaned and thickened the cloth -- thus making it 'full'.

Malachi is telling us that God is working on his people as a fuller works on new cloth -- vigorously working our spiritual fibres into a consistent and desirable condition, to be a full and effective offering in his service -- just as Jesus would be. Like all purifying work, it is rough and rugged, but it has to be to do its work; just as Jesus exemplified. This image also warns *us* against underestimating the demands of a life of faith and obedience.

In the Temple, not one but two holy people with lives steeped in faith and obedience, recognised Jesus as being from God, and I should bear in mind that neither was a priest, Simeon says that Mary's soul would be pierced; we know that her child was to be crucified; it was surely pierced then. Simeon and Anna recognised God's work was for real, our personal challenge is to make Christ real in our lives. Malachi tells us that God is working on us as a fuller works on cloth, Anna and Simeon's example encourages us to wait on God. Coming to know God and discerning his will are not instantaneous events, even if we experience a dramatic conversion like St Paul's. Even St Paul needed time to develop his understanding. Discernment is a slow, almost imperceptible growth in spiritual insight, In hope and trust, how much time are we prepared to give to waiting on God.

Today we have heard Luke's glorious proclamation that Jesus has come for 'All Peoples' and that he is a 'light' for all nations – including you and me if we give him the time and commitment, the faith and obedience. Amen.
