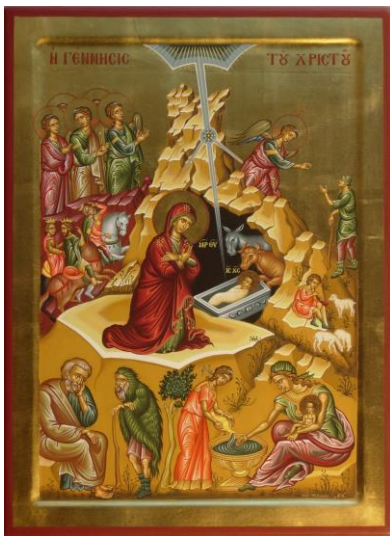

Church of St. Peter and St. Paul

Church of St. Peter and St. Paul, Exton (Hampshire) dating back to the 13th century, stands on the foundations of an earlier church built in 940. Of the four churches in the benefice, St. Peter and St. Paul is the only one with a 'weeping' chancel, in which the centre line of the chancel inclines to the south of the centre line of the nave, reflecting the inclination of Christ's head on the cross. The church has been worked on and modernised over the years, and recently the early 20th century stencil of the Tree of Life at the east end of the church was discovered, and restored to its original condition.
