The original endowment now provides an annual income which is managed by a number of locally recruited Trustees to provide financial help for the education of young people.

ELIGIBILITY is restricted as follows:

- The subject of the grant should be under 25 years old. Thus, college and university as well as parents of school children may apply.
- The subject of the grant should live within the Bridge Benefice, ie within the parish boundaries of Corhampton, Meonstoke, Droxford or Exton.
- There should be some evidence of financial need.
- Grants are not made in respect of private school fees.
