Is someone you know being abused?

The Clewer Initiative* tells us that there will be someone being abused in every community.

You may think we live in a beautiful part of the world where nothing like that could happen, but perpetrators may particularly welcome the isolation of a rural setting. That is a very unhappy thought, but one for which we must be prepared.

Would you know how to respond, if someone who is desperate approached you?

The church takes safeguarding very seriously, and so its senior leaders, those working with young people or vulnerable adults and PCC members are all trained, and re-trained at regular intervals.

Senior leaders are trained to a very high standard. Those working with

Why safeguarding is at the heart of our ministry

young people or vulnerable adults and PCC members are trained to have a minimum basic awareness of types of abuse – which can, sadly, be myriad, but include financial, emotional, trafficking and physical abuse.

They are also trained to respond in a non-judgemental way, to listen attentively, to record honestly and fairly, and to be caring and discrete.

However, they must make it clear to the vulnerable person that they need to take action, to protect the victim or survivor and take steps to support them, with the help of others.

The first person who will be contacted is our excellent Parish Safeguarding

Officer, Ali Pepper. Her email is: safeguarding@droxford.org and her number 01489 877928.

You will find on the Benefice website www.bridgechurches.org.uk a safeguarding page with contact details for out-of-hours and at weekends, as well as the names of people at the Diocese.

The Churchwardens, who have taken part in Safeguarding Leadership Training, have learnt how amazingly helpful the Diocesan staff can be, particularly where there can be an impact beyond the victim or survivor, such as to their wider family members and to the community.

There are some heart-breaking stories, but help is very much at hand.

Our churches hold fast to a spirit of welcome to all comers. We seek to be a church that loves, welcomes, protects, learns, serves, values, cares and believes.

We are committed to safeguarding as an integral part of ministry and mission, promoting a safer culture and the welfare of every child, young person and adult.

But we must all be alert to signs of abuse and what might pose a risk. We must all care for the victims, the survivors and those who are the subject of allegations.

We must do all we can to make our worshipping communities and congregations safe and welcoming havens for everyone.

Any action, no matter how small, could change or save the life of somebody in desperate circumstances.

Please be aware and seek help.

Two Meonstoke residents have received a community award from the Mayor of Winchester, Cllr Angela Clear, for their part in helping Ukraine refugees settle into new lives in Hampshire.

Clare Bohy-Smith and her mother Sue, who live at Rectory Lane, have been part of a team of ten volunteers working for the SNUG charity shop at Wallops Wood.

This was set up by volunteers just over a year ago to provide free clothing, furniture, toiletries, school uniforms, computers, fridges, pet food and much more, to over 100 families.

The Mayor's citation states that: "As a result of the team's tireless work, many Ukrainians have now settled into safe comfortable

homes and become more independent. The Meon Valley community can be proud of this dedicated team for helping them to integrate, and to return to some kind of normality."

SNUG co-organiser Sam Dunlop told The Bridge, "Sue and Clare have both done so much for us, sourcing and transporting clothing and furniture, and helping out in the shop.

"Clare was so enthusiastic she practically lived here!"

Sue said, "Clare has special needs, so this was something positive and worthwhile for her to

"As well as gathering items for SNUG from across Hampshire she also spent lots of time in the shop talking to the visitors and making them feel welcome."

Clare added, "I sometimes found I was delivering clothes and furniture to homes where people had absolutely nothing, and were sleeping on the floor.

"One lady was about to have a baby, and we managed to find her baby clothes, a pram and other essentials."





6. The Rev'd Canon Anthony Hulbert

Canon Anthony Hulbert is 83. He moved to Meonstoke in 2010, having previously lived at Fir Hill in Droxford, the home his family bought almost a century ago, and then at The Mill.

At age 18 he was commissioned into the Grenadier Guards and found himself in charge of a platoon stationed in Cyprus and north Africa. Later he studied history at Cambridge before deciding to join the church.

After nearly fifty decades as rector in five different Benefices, church rules required him to retire at the age of 70. But, as he says, "once ordained, always ordained," and he received special permission to continue officiating, and still does.

Since Fr. Tony Forrest left the Benefice eight month ago Anthony has been taking our services, and also in Hambledon and Newtown where they are also without a rector.

Here he talks of his eventful and fulfilling life, and chooses the records that have accompanied him on his journey.

1. Jack Hulbert: Who's been polishing the Sun?

I am told I am very distantly related to the actor and singer Jack Hulbert, though I'm not quite sure in what way. We had this song on a 78rpm record which we were always playing on our 'gramophone,' as it was called in those days.

One of my earliest memories is when I was seven or eight, going to the Kings Theatre in Portsmouth to see him perform, because we knew he would be singing it. We met him after the show and my father kept in touch with him for some years afterwards.

2. Dvorak: New World Symphony

I met my wife Nicola in 1962 on a kind of blind date. I was at Cambridge and I had been asked to host a supper party as a way of enabling people to meet

and get to know each other.

Nicola was at Cambridge Technical College and was one of the guests who had been invited. We hit it off, fell in love, and married three years later when I was at Wells Theological College, and she had begun working in a local bank.

Being on a student grant I didn't have any money, and she kept me really, until I was able to earn properly. We will be celebrating our 60th anniversary in two years' time. and this has always been one of our favourite pieces of music.

3. Bob Dylan: Where have all the Flowers Gone?

I was ordained in 1966 and appointed curate at Fareham, and four years later became ector at Wickham. It was the time of the Vietnam War, and this song reflects everything that was happening then.

The decision to serve in the church was a gradual one. At the age of 18 I and a friend had joined the Guards and had been posted to Cyprus during the EOKA emergency.

We were given a rough time, and the only person who helped us through it was the chaplain. It was my first indication that the church worked in a slightly different way to other organisations.

It was the fact that he had taken to the trouble to look out for us, when others had not.

Another trigger was when I joined a Cambridge mission in south London that was doing really wonderful things for the community: youth work, education, social action, that kind of

thing.

I measured that against what I had seen in the Officers' mess where there were some just interested in themselves.

Having been brought up as a Christian I began to seriously consider the church as a career. I didn't want to go into something that just made lots of money and live for myself, but to do something constructive for others.

4. Dave Bilbrough: Who can Separate us from the Love of God?

In 1979 I became vicar of a huge parish in Bedford with 600 on the electoral role, and with many of them attending church each week. It's hard to believe that now.

We recruited a team of young adults – interns you would call them today – who helped set up youth clubs and camps, a women's refuge, hospital visiting, the kind of things you don't often see today.

One of the team was an American called Keith Grogg. He played the guitar and sang this marvellous, evocative folk song to us, which I was to recall 30 years later in 2009 when Nicola suddenly developed bacterial meningitis.

Until then she had been completely fit, strong and active, but for eleven days she was unconscious and expected to die.

As she lay there I read to her the words of Dave's song, which come from Letter to the Romans, Chapter 8:

'For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.'

She recovered and told me that even while in a coma she had heard me reading it to her. It seemed a witness to the truth of the words.

5. Mendelsohn: How Lovely are the Messengers

After 13 years at Bedford I was appointed vicar at Leighton Buzzard.

She also made a puppet of an ass, so in the pulpit I asked the two of them to tell me what happened at the Nativity, as they were both there! I then related the story, with interpretation, to the congregation, who seemed to enjoy it once they had got over their surprise."

It was a tough job because you had to look after three country villages as well as the town, which was expanding at an enormous rate.

The large, ancient and much-loved parish church with its magnificent spire was falling into disrepair, so we launched a major restoration project which received enormous support across the town and country.

It is a central church which has a massive part to play in the life of the community, with its coffee shop, health and healing centre, children's holiday club, and much more besides.

I spent ten years there, and when I left I was asked by the choir what anthem I would like them to sing.

It was a wonderful choir, top notch, and I asked for this by Mendelsohn: "How lovely are the messengers that preach us the gospel of peace."

6. Halleluia Chorus from The Messiah

While my life has been very fulfilling, my only regret is disappointment that the Church of England has not managed to persuade a greater number of people than it has. It once played such a prominent part of our national culture, and it no longer does.

That's not to say, though, that its beliefs are not true or that parishes aren't doing constructive and useful things.

There is still a great need for a parish priest, and there is much that he or she can do to foster and enrich the community.

I think all the church can do is remain faithful to its calling and its gospel. The idea of a remnant of people - a small community - still keeping the Christian faith alive and well is a powerful vision, and it has been proved over the centuries that Christianity has always continued, and has never been

squashed at any time.

That's why I have chosen the Halleluia Chorus as my final record because it is full of triumph, hope and positivity, and with the conviction that in the end all will be well, and that God's love and mercy will be revealed to us all.

■ How would I cope on the island?

I've been used to being on my own at times, and I'm not without inner resources and, of course, I have a prayer life which I hope would continue. I believe there is a God in Heaven who looks after us, and that I would be sustained on the island.

■ My luxury item?

A pair of really comfortable walking shoes as I love walking and would enjoy exploring round the island. And as I have always loved dogs, I would like to have a dog as well, to accompany me on the walks.

■ The book I would take?

The Oxford Book of English verse, as I have always loved poetry.

■ The one record I would save from the waves?

The New World Symphony. It soothes the spirit!

It's time for those final summer jobs

It has been a dry summer so far, so before going away on holiday ensure that all recent planting is well watered and mulched to minimise drying out.

In September aerate lawns and apply autumn feed, spike and rake bald or compacted areas and re-seed. Be sure to keep lawns clear of leaves as autumn approaches as this reduces the risk of pests and diseases.

Plant winter flowering heathers in September. Erica carnea and Erica darleyensis will do very well on chalk as long as they get plenty of sun and are not allowed to dry out after planting.

However, summer flowering heathers, calluna vulgaris, will not survive on



Vegetables – Lift potatoes and onions to avoid unnecessary pest damage. Last sowings of radish, rocket and lettuce can be made in early August.

Now is also the time to sow spring cabbage, perpetual spinach and

winter lettuce. Runner beans are now coming into their own, but remember to keep them well watered, and keep an eye out for blackfly. Treat with proprietary pesticide as necessary, or spray with a solution of soapy water.

Fruit – Plant out strawberry plants that have rooted from runners, and they will fruit next year.

Cut out summer raspberry canes that have fruited to allow next year's canes to develop, and if you have not already done so finish summer pruning of gooseberries, red currants, apples and plums.

With the latter it is a good idea to combine pruning with harvesting so that any damage caused when picking can be remedied.

Herbaceous border – Continue dead heading and cut out tall or weak stems from plants that have finished flowering. Feed and deadhead dahlias and look out for aphids and blackfly and treat with soapy water or proprietary pesticide.

Take cuttings of alpines, penstemons, fuchsias and zonal pelargoniums. Make sure tall asters and Michaelmas daisies are well supported. As lavender flowers fade cut back stems to new pairs of shoots using secateurs.

Trees and Shrubs – Prune shrubs after they have finished flowering and pinch out new shoots of wisteria to about three or four leaves. Lightly prune or trim beech hedges, Eleagnus, escallonia, Hebe, holly, lavender, Pyracantha and privet.

Keep hydrangeas well watered to extend flowering

Containers – Keep well watered and continue dead heading, especially petunias, and you will be rewarded with flowers for several weeks to come.

In the greenhouse – Reduce watering and feeding of tomatoes as the fruits start to ripen, but make sure the soil remains moist. If it dries out and you then over water the fruit will split.

Be watchful for red spider mite and whitefly on cucumbers and spray as necessary or use sticky whitefly traps if pests are present.

The Brook Cottage Plant and Cake Sale held in May two weeks after the Coronation was an astonishing success — yet again!



Urgent Treatment Centre

The UTC at Petersfield is an alternative to the Emergency Department for both children and adults. It provides treatment for minor injuries and illnesses that are urgent but not life threatening, and is open between 8am and 8pm all year round.

We can help with problems such as:
• Sprains and strains • Suspected broken limbs • Minor head injuries • Minor scalds and burns • Skin infections and rashes • Feverish pain • Eye problems • Abdominal pain • Emergency contraception.

Patients are encouraged to call 111 first before arriving at the UTC as they will be able to take note of your symptoms and advise you on the best service to help you.

If you need to be seen at the UTC, please book an appointment via NHS 111 as this will reduce your waiting time on site.

Patients who go directly to the UTC without calling 111 will be clinically assessed by a triage nurse or other health professional, and will only be prioritised for treatment over booked appointments when clinically necessary.

Wilfrid's Café has had a brilliant trading surplus this year.

After paying all our costs to the church for utilities and other costs involved in running a café we have an amazing £8,000 to distribute in the form of grants to the community.

This is entirely thanks to our large team of volunteers and cake bakers, the local donors who continue to support us, the local businesses who help us in different ways, and to our lovely customers from Droxford and further afield.

Splash Route update

You will recall the excellent recent article in The Bridge about fourwheel drive vehicles driving up the River Meon in Droxford by the mill at Droxford.

HCC have been looking into this and are assessing how to establish the impact on the health of the river bed, banks and water quality.

Various surveys are being done which should be invaluable in taking positive steps. They are also looking at what the legal position is.

And finally, in the interests of balance, they will be engaging with something called the Trail Riders Fellowship regarding their current usage of the river. I will need to Google them to find out what they are, but I can have a guess!

Household waste: Help reduce council bills by £200,000 by recycling thoughtfully

Next time you visit your local recycling centre with a bag of mixed items to go in the "Household Refuse – Will not be Recycled" container, you may be asked to open it for inspection.

But don't worry, this isn't some officious new action to shame you, or worse, fine you for throwing away perfectly recyclable material.

In fact it's a friendly service, designed to help all of us become more aware of what we can and cannot recycle, and there will be people on hand to answer any questions and offer advice.

The aim is for Hampshire County Council to save up to the £200,000 of taxpayers' money spent every year sending unrecyclable waste to landfill or incineration. A wide range of waste can be recycled at our centres so it's worth a check before you visit.

Most HWRCs in Hampshire will be able to recycle the following

materials:

- Garden and green waste
- Metals
- Wood
- Cardboard
- Electrical equipment and appliances
- Batteries, printer cartridges, and light bulbs
- Furniture
- Clothing and textiles
- Paints, chemicals, engine oil and gas bottles.

So before you put items in the "Will not be Recycled" container, please take a few moments to make sure they aren't on the above list.

And if in doubt about which containers to use instead, the staff will be very happy to assist.

You can find out more about what is accepted, at your local Household Waste Recycling Centre.

Average speed cameras are now having an effect on bikers' behaviour

The Average Speed cameras along the A32 have already had a big impact, with a notable decrease in numbers of motorbikes and in antisocial riding styles.

There has also been some evidence of displacement, with bikers using other roads, notably towards East Meon. The police are stepping up their enforcement in the wider area, as promised.

The one area where progress is disappointing is in the deployment of 'acoustic cameras.' Jerry Pett has mentioned these on page 11.

This seems to be stuck in government studies. This is a shame, as these should be cheap, capable of being deployed across a wider area and should be a game changer.

So if you happen to see a local MP, or anyone else seeking your vote, don't forget to remind them to keep the pressure up.
